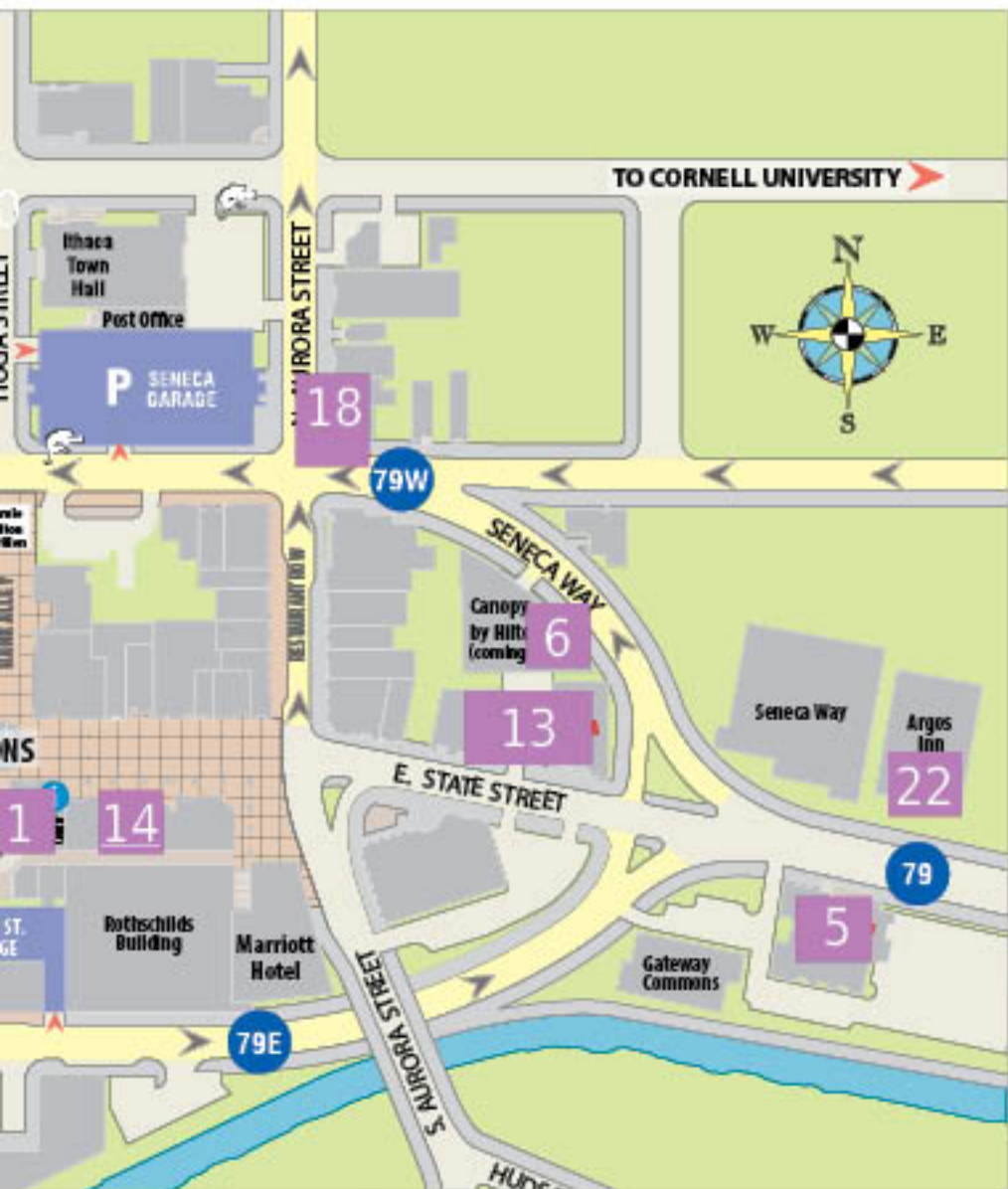

Collection by Jay Hart

Jay Hart explores different perspectives of the earth's surface in his exhibit at Collegetown Bagels on 203 North Aurora Street.

Jay is exhibiting metal prints that use geographic data to show broad sweeps of the earth. They are built from individual files for each Landsat natural color band, and from the higher res B+W Landsat band of 15m cell size. Such imagery is combined with elevation from SRTM and US/Canada/Russia raster elevation sources to yield a haze-corrected and topo shadow-enhanced output which often appears three dimensional.

19. Ten Forward Café, 115 E State St, upstairs at Autumn Leaves Used Bookstore

Paintings by Jill Hoffman at Ten Forward Cafe

Hoffman's paintings celebrate the otherworldly aspects of animals and nature. Her artwork stems from themes of surrealism, mythology, magic, dreams and transformation. For the month of October, Jill will offer a celestial twist to new paintings for this special Ten Forward Cafe edition."
